GENERAL INFORMATION

The Basic Law Enforcement Training (BLET) Program is offered during the day and also in the evening.



The Day Academy:

- Is given twice a year (one starting in January and another in August)
- 700+ hours over approximately four months.
- Meets Monday through Friday (as early as 0700 on exam days and ends at 1830 on days that include physical fitness and some Saturdays and evenings when needed).

The Evening Academy:

- Is given once a year (starting in February/ March graduating in December)
- Consists of 700+ hours over approximately nine months.
- Meets Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, (from 5:30 pm to 10:00 pm) and most Saturdays (8:00 am to 5:00 pm).



Applicants must meet the following criteria established by the North Carolina Criminal Justice Education & Training Standards Division of the Office of the Attorney General to attend BLET:



1. Be a U.S. Citizen
2. Be at least 20 years
3. Valid drivers license
4. G.E.D. or traditional high school diploma
5. 10th grade reading level
6. Not have been convicted of a **felony**
7. Not have been convicted of a crime of unlawful act as defined as Class B Misdemeanor within the five year period prior to the date of application for acceptance into the BLET academy.
8. Not have been convicted of four or more crimes or unlawful acts as defined as Class B misdemeanors regardless of the date of conviction.
9. Not have been convicted of four or more crimes or unlawful acts as defined as a Class A misdemeanors except the applicant may be enrolled if the last conviction occurred more than two years prior to the date of enrollment or
10. Not have been convicted of a combination of four or more Class A misdemeanors or Class B misdemeanors regardless of the date of conviction unless the individual intends to seek certification through the North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission. Priority admission will be given to individuals holding full-time employment with law enforcement agencies.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. Pick up an application packet from the FTCC Spring Lake Campus.
2. Complete an online application with FTCC
3. Complete an Accuplacer reading comprehension test no more than 1 year prior to academy start date.
4. Provide a copy of drivers license, birth certificate (or other documentation supporting U.S. citizenship), DD214 (if applicable), official copy of high school transcripts or G.E.D. transcripts.
5. Original criminal records check from the "Clerk of Courts" in each county in which the applicant has resided since their 16th birthday.
6. Complete a Medical History Statement (F-1), a physical exam that's recorded on the Medical examination Report (F-2), no more than 180 days prior to the academy start date.
7. A physical fitness assessment.
8. Sponsorship from a city, town, county, or state law enforcement agency is mandatory for all academy students.



PHYSICAL FITNESS ASSESSMENT

Vertical Jump – maximum height

Bench Press - maximum weight

Push-ups - maximum in one minute

Sit-Ups - maximum in one minute

1.5 Mile Run (not run/walk)

300 Meter Sprint

Acceptance into the academy will be contingent upon the candidate's ability to successfully complete the physical fitness assessment by achieving a minimum score of 125 points. A minimum of 1 point in each category must be obtained. (A score sheet will be provided in the application packet located at the Spring Lake campus.)

NOTE: A list of equipment needed for the academy will be provided in the application packet.
